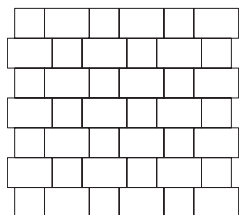


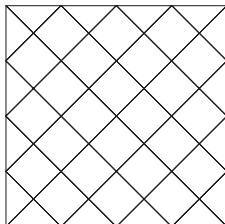
Tile Layouts

Tried and tested patterns used throughout the ages can appear classic or more modern depending on the tile you choose. Whichever you opt for, it's important to lay out an area of the complete pattern to confirm grout joint sizes required for installation.

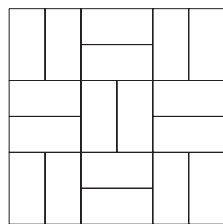
Flemish Bond



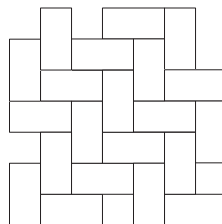
Diamond



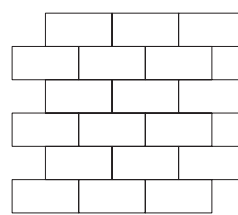
Basketweave



Short Herringbone

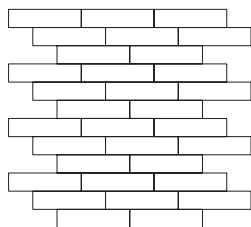


Brickbond/Subway

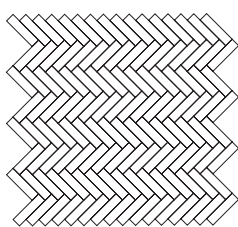

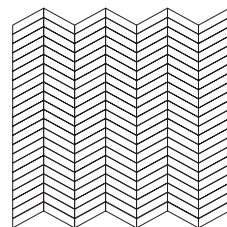

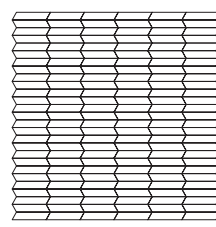
Long Herringbone

Note: Grout width may vary when laying tiles in the pattern formats. The roomset photography throughout this catalogue shows a number of ways to lay out your tiles.

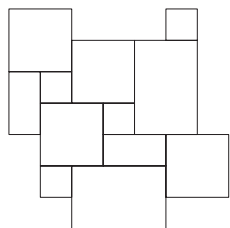

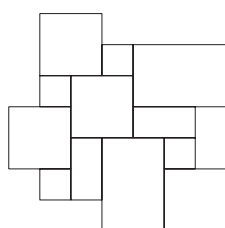

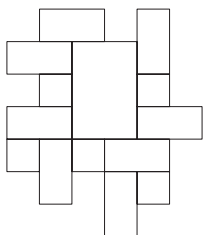
Roman Opus:

Ottoman (p28), Dorzano (p25)
 2 × 40.6×61 cm 4 × 40.6×40.6 cm
 2 × 20.3×40.6 cm 4 × 20.3×20.3 cm
 Each repeat (as shown left) is 1.48m²

Versailles Opus:

Temple Marsa (p49), Cathedral (p16-17)
 2 × 60.5×40 cm 4 × 40×40 cm
 2 × 20×40 cm 4 × 20×20 cm
 Each repeat (as shown left) is 1.44m²

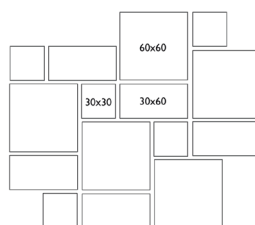
3 Tile Pavement

3 Tile Pattern
